- DIRECTIONS: [Ward Mountain Campground](#) is located about 10 miles east of Ely on Highway 6. To get there from Southern Nevada, take Interstate 215 north to Highway 93 north through Alamo. Turn left on Highway 318 just outside of Hiko. Go east Highway 6 towards Ely. Ward Mountain is on the right-hand side of the road at the summit. (If you get to Ely, you have gone too far.) From Ely, take Highway 6 east to Murry Summit. Left at Ward Mountain Campground.
- FOOD: District 19 is hosting potluck dinner Friday night, big breakfast on Saturday, snacks Saturday day and dinner on Friday, doughnut breakfast on Sunday. We will also have coffee throughout the weekend.
- WATER/SNACKS: There is a temporary water outage at the campsite. Please plan accordingly. Please bring your own water, soft drinks and snacks for the weekend.
- **CAMPING: The group campground has spots to set up tents around Campsite A. If you need a parking place for your camp trailer or if you are a car camper, you need to register for your own campsite here ([Ward Mountain link here](#)).**
- DOGS: The US Forest Service is serious about all dogs being on leashes while they are at the campground. There is a camp host who lives at the campground who will make sure your dog is leashed.
- WEATHER: It's raining in Ely right now which means it'll smell wonderful by this weekend and bring a little humidity. Daytime temperatures are expected to be in the lower 90s with overnight lows in the 60s. It's slightly cooler at the campground, but it will be just as bright. Hats, sunglasses and sunscreen strongly recommended.
- HEALTH AND SAFETY: Fires are only allowed in designated areas. Murray Summit is at about 7,400 feet. (Please hydrate now to avoid altitude issues.) Mosquitos are living their best life this year thanks to all the rain. Bug spray recommended. Hats, sunscreen and sunglasses are also highly recommended. (The summit is high and the sun is bright.) You will be in mountain lion, elk, antelope, badgers, porcupines and deer country. Rattlesnakes can also be active in the area. You might also see eagles, ravens, owls and hawks. In the unlikely chance that you happen come across any of these creatures in your path, please leave them ALONE.
- STUFF TO DO IN THE AREA: Great Basin National Park, Ward Charcoal Oven State Park, Cummins Lake, McGill Pool, Nevada Northern Railway Train Museum, White Pine County Golf Course, Frisbee Golf and more.
- SUPPLIES/EMERGENCY SERVICES: Available in Ely.
